

45SMAR - The Only Two Formulas You Need to Know to Become a Data Ninja

Top 20 Questions & Answers

1. Q: Can you share an example of each formula?

2. Q: Can you use VLOOKUP to bring back multiple values in one cell?

A: If you are using a multi-select dropdown column with multiple values, then you can have a single VLOOKUP bring back all values in that cell. To have VLOOKUP bring back values from multiple cells, use multiple VLOOKUPs. 3. Q: Can INDEX utilize non-adjacent column ranges?

A: Yes. This is part of why it is a useful function. In combination with a MATCH formula, INDEX can utilize non-adjacent column ranges. For example, the MATCH function will go and find the row number that a given value exists in, and the INDEX formula will retrieve the value in a separate/non-adjacent column in that given row number generated by the MATCH formula. This is similar to a vlookup in function that does not require adjacency.

4. Q: What's the main difference between VLOOKUP and INDEX & MATCH

A: VLOOKUP looks across an *entire* "table" or "array" to go and get information matching the key, whereas INDEX(MATCH(specifies two columns -- it's more straightforward, arguably)

5. Q: Can an INDEX range be from one sheet and a MATCH range be from another?

A: Yes, as long as both ranges are the same length.

6. Q: Can I use @row inside of these formulas?

7. Q: Can I get someone at Smartsheet to take a look at some of the formulas on my sheet to make sure I'm on the right track?

8. Q: Can you use VLOOKUP to search on several cells instead of a single cell?

A: No, but you can concatenate values from several cells to create a unique value, and then use vlookup to search off that unique value.

9. Q: How do you concatenate two cells in Smartsheet.

A: In the third cell, use a + sign between the two cells you're referencing.

10. Q: What's an example of when I wouldn't use FALSE at the end of a VLOOKUP?

A: If you're trying to find the closest match, but not an exact match. For example, if you have a price sheet that has the amount for 5 units and another row with the amount 10 units. When looking up a quantity of 6, you can return the amount for 5 units.

11. Q: How do I keep the range in a VLOOKUP from changing when I'm autofilling cells?

A: In the formula, place a \$ sign in front of the column name and/or row number to keep them from increasing when autofilling.

12. Q: IS INDEX/MATCH more efficient than VLOOKUP?

A: Yes, it is faster and uses less cell links when cross referencing a sheet.

13. Q: I have a huge sheet and it takes a long time to load because I have so many VLOOKUP or INDEX & MATCH formulas on it. What can I do to remedy this?

A: We have a Pivot App that can lookup values and paste them in your sheet, so that you don't have to calculate every time you open your sheet. Here is a link to that. https://www.smartsheet.com/marketplace/premium-apps/pivot-app

14. Q: Do these formulas work in the Sheet Summary section of my sheet?

15. Q: How do I keep someone from changing the formula on my sheet?

A: Just make them an editor of the sheet and lock the row or column in question. Here's a link for more information on that.

16. Q: Can you use VLOOKUP to look up something that is horizontally?

A: No, but you can use INDEX & MATCH to do that.

17. Q: I'm getting an error with those formulas, what am I doing wrong?

18. Q: It won't let me put the formula in a date column?

A: Sounds like you have dependencies enabled on your sheet. So you'll either need to use a date column that's not driving your Gantt chart or you'll need to turn off your dependencies. This link will help you resolve that.

19. Q: How do I lookup a date?

A: You'll either need to reference a cell in a date column, or you'll need to plug the DATE function into your VLOOKUP or INDEX & MATCH. https://help.smartsheet.com/function/date

20. Q: How do I get a new row to automatically copy the formula into it without having to manually add it.

A: If the formula is in two rows above a new cell, it will automatically be copied down into the new row.
